Dear Sir,

I thank you for yours of August 24, Re Mr W.B. MacDonald, Department of Health Sanitary Inspector. I will await your further communication.

Further to my letter of August 20th; I am enclosing a copy of the CEMETERY INFORMATION SHEET and a folder showing additional information (plans and list of burials.)

The records are not as complete as they should be, mostly because records that my predecessors should have had and turned over to me were either not had by them or not turned over. The names of all that are buried in the cemetery are listed and placement in the cemetery noted on the plan (No. 2). Further particulars are no doubt obtainable from the Department of ~~Vista~~ Vital Statistics.

Re No. 1 on Hist of Burials.

This woman was first buried in another piece of land intended for a cemetery in 1934, but as it was found that this site was un-obtainable for a cemetery; she was transferred to the present site in 1935.

Re No 28 on list of Burials.

This man was first buried in Vancouver (Cremation.) 1956. His ashes were transferred to the Pemberton Cemetery 1957, his ashes being placed in the same grave as his wife Mrs E.B. Girling, No 2 on the List. Hence though 28 persons are listed as buried, there are only 27 Grave sites used.
