A meeting of the working committee was held on the site of the Cemetery on the afternoon of August 21<sup>st</sup> 1935, all members being present with the exception of Mr. Ross, who was away from home.

It was agreed that Mr. W. C. Girling should act as Secretary-Treasurer and Mr. Taylor as Collector.

The  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre of ground given by Messrs Wilson Bros. was paced out, being approximately 30 yards by 30 yards. Also the  $\frac{1}{8}$ <sup>th</sup> of an acre, this being 25 x 25 yards.

Mr. Girling was requested to arrange for the early survey of the plot and for the drawing up of a legal deed of gift.

Mr. Taylor undertook to see the road for some with a view to having the road to the Cemetery graded up. It was agreed that the  $\frac{1}{8}$ <sup>th</sup> acre should be levelled off either by team or power work, and that Mr. Eric Githen be asked to do this work around the existing graves.

Fence.

As regards the fence it was decided to use 5 ft. Paige wire already at Pemberton, at a cost of \$10, with cedar posts cut 7'6" long and 6" at top from poles now lying at Nile 62. The posts to be creosoted at base and spaced 5 feet apart with a 6" x 6" rail on top to which the wire may be fastened.

Gates.

Mr. Taylor was asked to obtain iron gates similar to illustration given by Messrs Marshall Wells & Co. These gates to be either 4 ft. or 5 ft. wide and to be placed centrally at the east end of the  $\frac{1}{8}$ <sup>th</sup> acre plot.

A working Bee was held on October 8<sup>th</sup> 1935, the following being present:- A. Ross, G. Ross, J. Ronayne Junr., Ronald Ronayne, Robbie Miller, G. Ginnse, L. Van Broom, Mr. Taylor, Barry Girling, Christopher Girling and W. C. Girling, Eric Githen.

The ground having previously been levelled, disced and harrowed by Mr. St. Wilson & Mr. Eric Githen and the posts creosoted by Mr. Taylor, postholes were dug, posts erected, the Paige wire stretched and fastened and the 6" x 6" Cedars nailed to the top of the posts. The iron gates were hung and the enclosure seeded down with special grass seed.

A meeting of the working Committee was held at the Cemetery at 2 p.m. on Monday September 20<sup>th</sup> 1935, all members being present except Mr. Fraser who was unable to attend.

Site Survey.

Mr. Girling read correspondence which had taken place with reference to the proposed survey. He pointed out that when Mr. Dawson B.C.L.S. of Lillooet had been asked to carry out the survey he drew attention to the fact that the Cemetery site encroached upon the Government road allowance of 33 feet each side of the Taylor-Wilson boundary fence, and that until the Department of Public Works had dealt with this matter it would be useless to come in.

Road allowance

Correspondence was also read in connection with this road allowance which concluded with a letter from Mr. Dixon, Chief Engineer of the Public Works Department at Victoria, in which he stated "This is to advise that this Department will not require more than a 33' road along the south boundary of District Lot 171 through and to give access to the proposed cemetery. I assume that the ~~33~~ proposed 33' road would not encroach on any of the existing roads."

Stakes were driven at the corners of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre, and it was agreed that the levelling and fencing should be carried out forthwith. Mr. Ross undertook to organize a 'bee' for the purpose of erecting the fence. Mr. Rouayne promised to supply 300 lin. feet of 6x6 cedar, to run along the tops of the fence posts.

The secretary was authorized to purchase a Minute Book in which all records in connection with the Cemetery should be kept.
